

Key Events of the French Revolution



August 26, 1789: The Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen is approved.

States that all people are born **free** and have **equal rights**.



Key Events of the French Revolution

January 21, 1793: King Louis XVI (16th) is tried and executed as a traitor.



Key Events of the French Revolution

June 1793: Reign of Terror begins.

Any suspected enemies of the revolution are killed by the thousands.



Key Events of the French Revolution

November 9, 1799: Napoleonic era begins and French Revolution ends.

Napoleon Bonaparte takes over control of France and declares himself emperor.



Isabel II of Spain



After the death of Fernando VII (7th) his daughter, Isabel II, had to succeed him. As she was a minor, there were two regents between 1833 and 1843: María Cristina de Borbón (her mother) and Baldomero Espartero.

Carlist Wars





Infante Carlos, uncle to Isabel II, claimed the throne in 1833 after Fernando VII's death, starting the First Carlist War. The Carlist Wars ended with the expulsion of Carlos from Spain.

Isabel II of Spain



In 1843, when she was 13, Isabel II became queen of Spain. She ruled until 1868.

The political parties in the reign of Isabel II: Moderate Liberals and Progressive Liberals

Moderate Liberals

- Were supported by the upper classes.
- Defended a more restricted freedom.
- During their time in government the Constitution of 1845 was approved. It supported the Crown and the bourgeoisie.

Progressive Liberals

- Were supported by the middle and lower classes.
- Wanted there to be more freedom.
- Demanded that the Courts have more power than the monarch.

Exile of Isabel II





<u>VOCAB</u> Exile = Exilio

In 1868 a group of soldiers rose up against Isabel II and she had to go into exile. In 1869 a new constitution was proclaimed and Spain became a parliamentary monarchy with Amadeo I of Savoy elected as king.


